What happened at Derweze?

Not far from the village of Derweze (in Russian, it is Darvaza), a Soviet drilling rig hit an underground cavern, which subsequently collapsed and formed a deep pit, almost a hundred meters across. It was spewing toxic gases. In order to contain the hazard, the gases were set alight, with the expectation that the gas would burn off in a few days.

Can Turkmen put out a fire at Derweze door to Hell?

Despite the Derweze Door to Hell's potential as a tourist site, Turkmen President Gurbanguly Berdimukhamedov issued orders for local officials to find a way to put out the fire, after his 2010 visit to the crater.

Will the gates of Hell at Derweze make a dent?

Impressive though it looks, the Gates of Hell at Derweze seems unlikely to make much of a dent in those numbers. The Gates of Hell isn't the only Middle Eastern reserve of natural gas that's been on fire in recent years. In neighboring Iraq, the Baba Gurgur oil field and its gas flame have been burning for over 2,500 years.

Did Soviet geologists find natural gas in the Karakum Desert?

In 1971, Soviet geologists punched through the crust of the Karakum Desert about seven kilometers (four miles) outside of the little village of Derweze, Turkmenistan, population 350. They were searching for natural gas--and did they ever find it!

Why is the crater 'Derweze' called 'gate to Hell'?

Fittingly, the name 'Derweze' means 'gate' in the Turkmen language, so locals have dubbed the burning crater the 'Gate to Hell'.

How deep is a gas crater in Turkmenistan?

Located about 260 kilometres (160 mi) north of Ashgabat, the capital of Turkmenistan, it has a diameter of 60-70 metres (200-230 ft) and a depth of about 30 metres (98 ft). Another nearby gas crater is fenced off and has a distinct odor.
