How many oil wells were drilled in the Barrow area?

The remaining 9holes were drilled in the Barrow area between 1953 and 1974. These holes are categorized as an exploratory oil well,core test,or temperature monitoring well. In 1982,the BLM inherited the responsibility to assess,plug,and clean up the wells that the U.S. Navy and USGS left behind.

How many oil and gas fields did the US Navy drill?

In the first period,from 1944 to 1952,the U.S. Navy drilled 91 holes,locating eightsmall oil and gas fields (Fish Creek,Gubik,Meade,Simpson Peninsula,South Barrow,Square Lake,Umiat and Wolf Creek). In the second period,from 1975 to 1981,Husky Oil Corporation,working under contract for both the U.S. Navy and USGS,drilled 36 holes.

How many legacy wells were drilled in the NPR-a?

Legacy wells were drilled within and adjacent to the NPR-A prior to 1982,when BLM held its first lease sale. A total of 136test holes were drilled under two distinct drilling periods,both sponsored by the U.S. Government to explore for oil and gas resources.

Who made the first North Slope oil drilling expedition?

The nucleus of the men for the first North Slope oil drilling expedition came from Naval Construction Battalion 12. These were men who had built and fought their way in Alaska from Kodiak to the bloody shores of Attu. These men were Seabees,the legendary construction men of the US Navy.

How did Alaska become a modern day oil producer?

The path to Alaska's modern day oil prosperity began with a top priority and long forgotten WWII expedition. This mission was a true epic,worthy of remembrance. 'The difficult we can do at once,the impossible takes a little longer.' Alaskan people always knew some sort of oil supply lay beneath the Arctic.

How did Alaska explorers find oil sand?

For generations, Alaska Natives collected tarry lumps of sand and burned them for warmth. Early explorers mentioned finding oil sands. Rumors floated around of tar-filled lakes north of the Brooks Range. The "King of the Arctic," Charles Brower, reported oil seeps along the Arctic Coast to the chief geologist of Standard Oil Company in the 1920s.
