What is a Hakuryu 5 rig?

The Hakuryu-5 rig is a twin lower hull, column stabilized, propulsion-assisted semi-submersible drilling unit, which was designed through the engineering collaboration of JDC and Mitsubishi Heavy Industries and commissioned in July 1977 at Mitsubishi Hiroshima Shipyard.

What happened to Japan Drilling's hakuryu-5 semisubmersible rig?

Japan Drilling's Hakuryu-5 semisubmersible rig is nearing the end of its contract with Petronas Carigali and will soon depart Malaysia. The 3rd generation, 1,640-ft unit has been working with Petronas since September 2022.

Japan Drilling Co., Ltd. (JDC) is pleased to announce that its subsidiary company "Hakuryu 5, Inc." has entered into a drilling contract with INPEX Offshore San-in Co., Ltd for the provision of a semi-submersible drilling rig "HAKURYU-5". (Former name: SUMITOMO FUDOSAN MITA TWIN BLDG. WEST WING)

How much water can Hakuryu 5 drill?

HAKURYU-5 is designed to perform drilling operations in maximum 1,640 ft (Option 1,970 ft). of water with 3,600 m.tons of deck load. In 2009, lower hull was upgraded by installing "deep dish" for life enhancement, structural improvement and increase of variable load.

Where is hakuryu-5 located?
