



# How to become a company man on a drilling rig

Who are the personnel on a drilling rig called?

The majority of the personnel on the drilling rig, called 'the rig crew', are employees of the drilling contractor. The company man is the on-site manager and lead representative of the operating/exploration company and is "in charge" of the drilling and all associated activities.

How do I become an oil rig worker?

Gain experience as a mechanic. Many oil rig workers have mechanical jobs. You can also seek training as an electrician, cook, medic, and engineer to become a valued part of the auxiliary oil rig staff. Get in touch with friends, family members, or acquaintances who are oil rig workers.

How do rig personnel work?

On large, complex rigs, additional personnel are required. A representative from the client company called the drilling foreman or company man is typically present on the rig. The company representative is in charge of all drilling operations at the wellsite, including safety. On offshore and remote land locations, rig personnel stay at the wellsite.

Who owns a drilling rig?

Most gas and oil-drilling exploration companies rent or lease the drilling rig from a drilling company who owns the rig, the drilling contractor. The majority of the personnel on the drilling rig, called 'the rig crew', are employees of the drilling contractor.
